

UUA Reviewing Principles and Purposes

For decades, the Unitarian Universalist Association has focused our efforts around the seven principles and six sources, as described in the UUA Bylaws Article II. Last updated in 1987, they are periodically reviewed to see if they continue to reflect who we are and encourage us to strive for a better world.

In 2017, discussions around adding an 8th principle focused on anti-racism began at General Assembly. This year a special commission is reviewing article 2, and have prepared a draft revision. This new revision does not use the seven or eight principle approach, but a different method of reflecting our values. You can learn more at this website:



Walking St. Olav's Way



Please come to our regular Sunday service on December the 11th if you can. Look for more about that service in next week's Beacon.


