Messiah.

Black Panther leader Fred Hampton was gunned down by Chicago police and federal agents at age 21. Although his killing was ruled a justifiable homicide, history makes clear that it was more likely a political assassination. Less a high-stakes game of cat-and-mouse than a densely layered study of cats, mice and the rats who manipulate them, this is a throwback movie, asking the audience to consider the not-too-distant past of anti-Black racism as prologue to its similarly murderous present.

The group discussion will begin at 7:00, but the zoom link will be active by 6:45 to allow social interaction before the discussion.


