

Cedars Knitting/Crafting Circle



We invite you to join us on Tuesday September 14th at 1:30 p.m.

Seeking "Salvation by Bibliography" as our late friend Marvin Evans used to say, we meet to discuss books that can intrigue and might enlighten us.

Our summer selection, proposed by Mark Shaffer, is **The Requiem of the Human Soul** by *Jeremy Lent*.

In this provocative novel, the reader is faced with challenging questions about spirituality, history, and global politics: Could our race "evolve" itself to a higher plane? At what cost and benefit? If we lost what is now the "human race" as a result, would that be so bad, given our sordid and shameful history? On the other hand, is there something special, our soul, worth keeping at any price? Ultimately, this novel forces the reader to grapple with the fundamental question: what does it mean to

navigate the presence of COVID-19 and begin conceptualizing what comes next with our online presence, we need people to assist with the technology side of things. Currently we hope to find a few individuals to help with recording and video editing. No prior experience is necessary, but it does help to have a familiarity with technology and a willingness to learn.

Worship Associates: In this role you get a chance to work with Rev. Zackrie and other service leaders to reflect on a topic and share your voice with others. This is a great opportunity for people to develop as a public speaker or experiment with creative ways of conveying an idea. In addition, being a worship associate is a great way to become more widely known within the Cedars community.

Pastoral Care Concerns

In discussion with the Pastoral Care Team, **Rev. Zackrie** confirmed that he would appreciate being informed if anyone in the Cedars community tests positive for Covid-19.

The information will remain confidential if the person so wishes, but Rev. Zackrie's awareness could help with contact tracing as well as determining what support and possible services could be offered by Pastoral Care Team members and perhaps the larger Cedars UU community as well.

Guidelines for using Cedars Center

The Cedars Board is making the following restrictions to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission to the few people who must enter the Cedars Center to keep us functioning.

- 1. Permission from staff or Board Member is required for entry.
- 2. Sign in when entering and sign out when leaving.
- 3. Use hand sanitizer when entering.
- 4. Wear a mask and practice social distancing.
- 5. Avoid touching your face.
- 6. Please disinfect high contact surfaces when you enter and before you leave: door handles, light switches, computer mouse and keyboard, desks, tabletops, countertops, sinks, toilet,

implementing special safety practices for Covid-19 protection during all in-person events planned during the remainder of the summer.

Detailed information and instruction about these practices is available on the **Cedars website**, and the basic thinking about masking has been summarized in the illustrations located at the bottom of this newsletter.


