## **In-Person Services Update**

Starting on October 24th, Cedars will begin holding in-person services at the Island School. These services will take place on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month with virtual services continuing to take place on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. In months with a 5th Sunday, we will alternate between inperson and virtual services. This alternating schedule was developed in consultation with the Worship Technology Team, Worship Associates, Reopening Task Force, and the Cedars Board. It is meant to accommodate those who have expressed a need for inperson worship, as well as those who are unable to join in person or who do not feel comfortable doing so. On in-person Sundays, we also plan to have "mini-gatherings" on Zoom at mid-day for those who aren't able to attend in-person services to offer a chance for people to check-in, reflect, and share joys and sorrows.

For safety, we need to limit participation for indoor services to those persons who are vaccinated, so please be prepared with your vaccination card. All in attendance will be required to wear masks. To accommodate those who are unable to be vaccinated either due to age or medical reasons, limited seating will be available outside, east of Webster Hall. For more information about possible outdoor seating, please contact Mike Cox, Kassia Sing (Co-Presidents) or Reverend Zackrie. Doors and windows will be open for ventilation; it will be cold. Bring a blanket! Dress warmly! Outdoor childcare will be provided for children under 12. Youth over 12 are welcome to attend the service with family.

# Faith Formation at Cedars

Fall is just around the corner, and that means children in our congregation will be returning to school. Our

congregation's Faith Formation (AKA Religious Education) programming generally follows the school year, which means preparing for ways to bring all ages together. We have several unique challenges ahead. The surges in COVID-19 and unavailability of vaccines for all ages means being cautious on how we gather in person.

We are also looking for a Director of Faith Formation to lead the development and coordination of our program. Looking to the near term, a group is exploring ways to serve our children so they have an active sense of belonging in the congregation and a developing understanding of Unitarian Universalist Values. We all long for a time when we can be present together, whether

roles that we are hoping to fill and find people willing to join the rest of the team in meaning making work we do.

**Preaching: O**nce a month Rev. Zackrie is away from Cedars, and we need people willing to preach and lead services on these dates. This is your chance to share your thoughts on a topic with the rest of the community. Preaching can also provide you with a chance to deepen your own understanding on a topic as you research, write, and reflect in preparation.

**Worship Tech Team:** As we continue to navigate the presence of COVID-19 and begin conceptualizing what comes next with our online presence, we need people to assist with the technology side of things. Currently we hope to find a few individuals to help with recording and video editing. We also need help running the sound system at in-person services. No prior experience is necessary, but it does help to have a familiarity with technology and a willingness to learn.

Worship Associates: In this role you get a chance to work with Rev. Zackrie and other service leaders to reflect on a topic and share your voice with others. This is a great opportunity for people to develop as a public speaker or experiment with creative ways of conveying ideas. In addition, being a worship associate is a great way to become more widely known within the Cedars community.

Religious Education and Faith Formation are integral to who we are as Unitarian Universalists. Paving the way for an inclusive, all ages experience will be an important step in preparing for the coming year.







# **Social Action News**

Kitsap Immigration and Assistance Center has released the following:

We are paying close attention to the events unfolding in Afghanistan. Like all of you, we are heartbroken for the human beings caught in this humanitarian crisis, especially women, girls and LGBTQ+ Afghans.

The Puget Sound region will be receiving an influx of refugees in the next days and weeks. There are numerous ways you can help with their resettlement. Both temporary and long-term housing is an urgent priority. Additionally, volunteers are needed to provide host homes, transport people from the airport, help settle people into apartments or assist with English language classes. Donations of household and other necessities, as well as cash donations are also needed.

Here are some committed organizations that are providing assistance, and all need volunteers and financial support.

The International Rescue Committee: This agency has a webpage with updated on-theground information, wish lists of items to purchase for "Welcome Kits" (linked here), and volunteer opportunities.

**World Relief, Seattle:** This agency is calling for volunteers and donations (**linked here**) and has information for the Afghan community as well as volunteers and partners.

**The Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service:** This organization is seeking volunteers for airport pickups, mentoring, tutoring, and meal deliveries. They also need financial donations (**linked here**).

Jewish Family Services, Seattle: They have created an Amazon wish list for household items and other necessities (linked here). other necessities. They are also looking for car seats and are accepting financial donations (linked here).

**Afghan Health Initiative:** This group provides access and support for physical and mental

## **In-Person Safety at Cedars**

# **Guidelines for using Cedars Center**

The Cedars Board is making the following restrictions to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission to the few people who must enter the Cedars Center to keep us functioning.

- 1. Permission from staff or Board Member is required for entry.
- 2. Sign in when entering and sign out when leaving.
- 3. Use hand sanitizer when entering.
- 4. Wear a mask and practice social distancing.


# **Pastoral Care Concerns**
