Greetings! My name is **Carol Ann Davidson** and I am the Board liaison to a new unified Social Justice Committee.



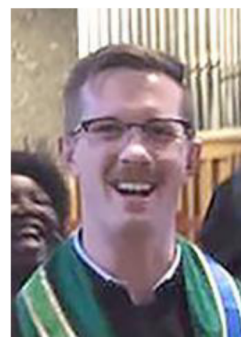

Be a part of Worship at Cedars

As we prepare to enter the fall and gear back up for the program year, we are looking for individuals ready to help with the creation of weekly worship. There are a few important roles that we are hoping to fill and find people willing to join the rest of the team in meaning making work we do.

Preaching: Once a month Rev. Zackrie is away from Cedars, and we need people willing to preach and lead services on these dates. This is your chance to share your thoughts on a topic with the rest of the community. Preaching can also provide you with a chance to deepen your own understanding on a topic as you research, write, and reflect in preparation.

Worship Tech Team: As we continue to navigate the presence of COVID-19 and begin conceptualizing what comes next with our online presence, we need people to assist with the technology side of things. Currently we hope to find a few individuals to help with recording and video editing. We also need help running the sound system at in-person services. No prior experience is necessary, but it does help to have a familiarity with technology and a willingness to learn.

Worship Associates: In this role you get a chance to work with Rev. Zackrie and other service leaders to reflect on a topic and share

service and a Social Justice Committee that focused on education and outreach events. At present, both committees have dissolved although Super Suppers continue to be supported by a few former committee members. The Cedars Board's vision is to revitalize our efforts with a newly formed Social Justice Committee that will join together with the Faith Formation and Green Sanctuary Committee members to plan a year in which Cedars recommits to social action projects and social justice work on Bainbridge Island and North Kitsap.

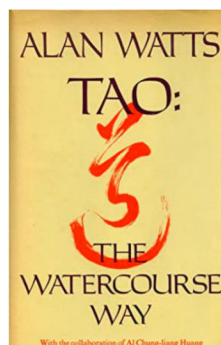

Seeking "Salvation by Bibliography" as our late friend Marvin Evans used to say, we meet to discuss books

that can intrigue and might enlighten us.

Our January selection, proposed by Richard Wilson, is **TAO: The Watercourse Way** by **Alan Watts**. In this final (and posthumously published) product of a prolific and creative life of spiritual exploration, Alan Watts (with collaborator Ai Chung-liang Huang), shared the deep and meaningful interrelationship of Taoism and the Chinese language.

"Just as Chinese writing is at least one step closer to nature than ours, so the ancient philosophy of the Tao is of a skillful and intelligent following of the course, current, and grain of natural phenomena — seeing human life as an integral feature of the world process, and not as alien and opposed to it."

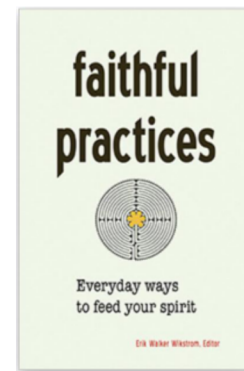

Safe Gatherings at Cedars



Because we are responsible citizens and follow the science, we need to be ready as a community to apply the safe behavior we practice in other parts of our lives to our spiritual home too. We should feel confident that we can safely gather as a community if we:

- Wear a mask.
- Vaccinate.
- Physically distance if indoors.
- Don't go near others if sick, exposed to COVID, or tested positive for COVID.

Our Board of Trustees recommendations for responsible behavior at in-person meetings and gatherings are as follow:

Webster Hall In-Person Services

All attendees must wear a mask and be vaccinated to sit indoors, but outdoor seating is available for anyone interested. Indoor seating capacity is limited so pre-registration is required. Dress warmly since doors and windows will be open.

Children under 12 can choose to be with Archer Philip and Erin Kempkes for an hour of fun; parents need to sign up to reserve spots for kids.

Social Action News

Kitsap Immigration and Assistance Center has released the following:

We are paying close attention to the events unfolding in Afghanistan. Like all of you, we are heartbroken for the human beings caught in this humanitarian crisis, especially women, girls and LGBTQ+ Afghans.

The Puget Sound region will be receiving an influx of refugees There are numerous ways you can help with their resettlement. Both temporary and long-term housing is an urgent priority. Additionally, volunteers are needed to provide host homes, transport people from the airport, help settle people into apartments or assist with English language classes. Donations of household and other necessities, as well as cash donations are also needed.

Here are some committed organizations that are providing assistance, and all need volunteers and financial support.

The International Rescue Committee: This agency has a webpage with updated on-the-ground information, wish lists of items to purchase for "Welcome Kits" ([linked here](#)), and volunteer opportunities.

World Relief, Seattle: This agency is calling for volunteers and donations ([linked here](#)) and has information for the Afghan community as well as volunteers and partners.

The Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service: This organization is seeking volunteers for airport pickups, mentoring, tutoring, and meal deliveries. They also need financial donations ([linked here](#)).

Jewish Family Services, Seattle: They have created an Amazon wish list for household items and other necessities ([linked here](#)), other necessities. They are also looking for car seats and are accepting financial donations ([linked here](#)).

meeting in other locations:

- Wear a mask.
- Physically distance.
- Complete safety/health questionnaire; send to office administrator for filing (in case of tracing).
- Ventilate the room.
- Limit the number of attendees.
- Verify vaccination status prior to gathering (if an attendee is medically exempt, organizer should consider using an outdoor space or providing an option such as Zoom)

Cedars Center Meeting Space

Cedars committees and groups may now reserve meeting space in our office facility by contacting the Office Administrator at: office@cedarsuuchurch.org.

- All guests must be fully vaccinated and wearing masks.
- Have an inclusive option for those unable or uncomfortable being in the same room with others; if an attendee is medically exempt from vaccination, meeting organizer should consider an option for them to attend (Zoom, hold meeting outdoors on patio if weather permits).
- Complete safety/health questionnaire for each attendee (kept on stool in Cedars Center foyer).
- Ventilate the room by opening a few windows; also run the air purifier on speed 3 during the meeting.
- Limit number of physically distanced seats available; 10 guests is the maximum attendance allowed.
- Clean all surfaces and throw out meeting-room trash after meeting.

The Team meets just once a month with our minister. We are now expanding the Team, and we would love to have you join us.

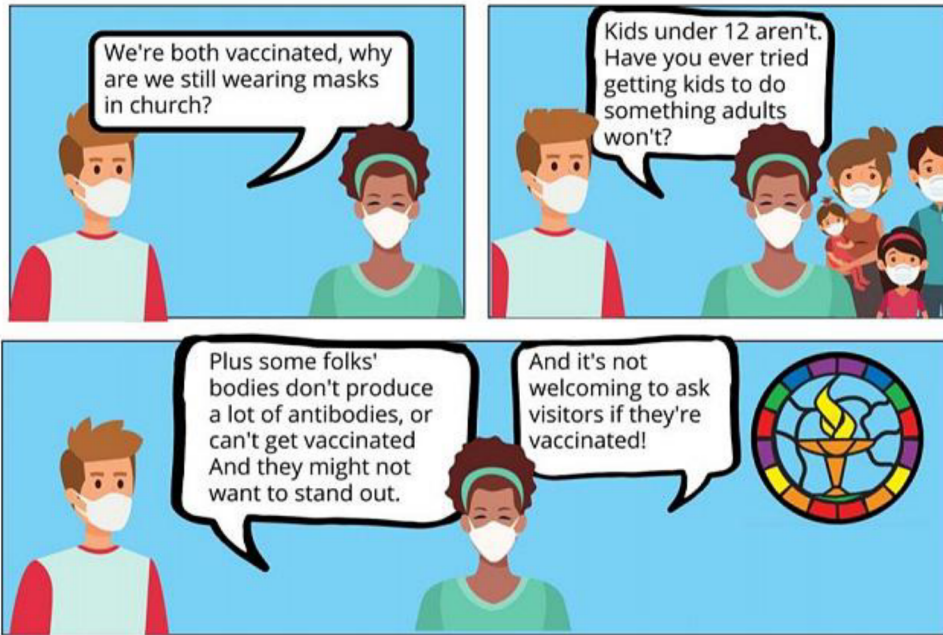

Pastoral Care Concerns

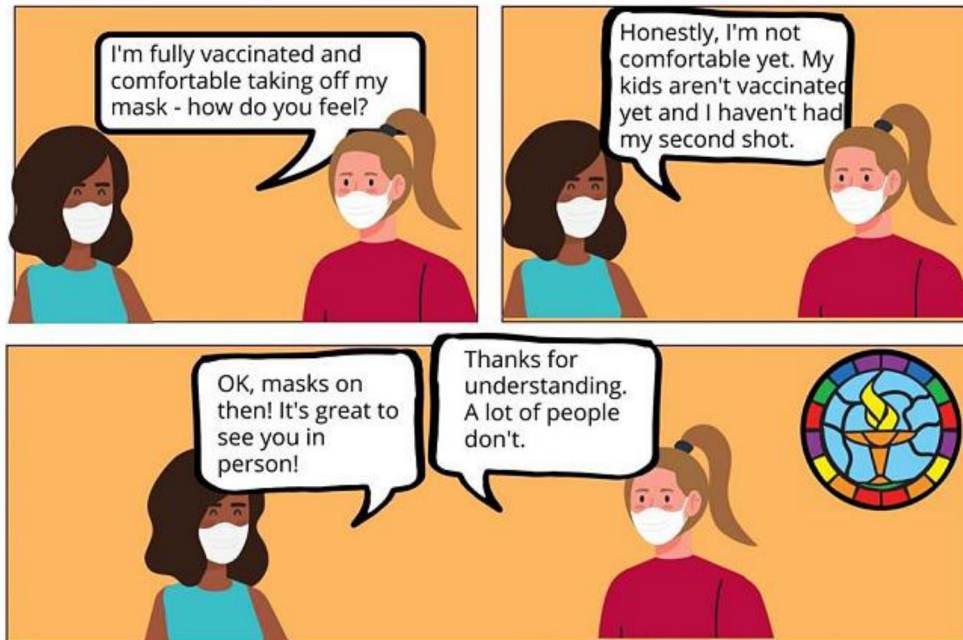
