

Our year-long exploration of promises and possibilities



Over the course of the past year, the Board had been inviting and listening to many stories of connection as well as disconnection in a variety of discussion settings and gatherings.

In response, at the congregational meeting in June, members and friends were asked to brainstorm ideas for moving forward and deepening a sense of belonging in four suggestively titled areas of focus:

- Come, Come Whoever You Are
- Beyond Pastoral Care
- Living Our Values
- Cedars of the Future

The first three areas have been discussed in earlier Beacon issues, and this week we consider the fourth area: Cedars of the Future, which poses the challenging question: How do we expand, enrich, and nurture the Cedars community, and especially, how do we keep and attract more families?



Hoping to see Cedars more inclusive and welcoming, we are interested in reviving the film discussion group, which will now be called **Film Fans**.


We will meet on Zoom and be open to all who are interested in watching selected films on their own and then meeting to discuss, analyze, and interpret the films, often using this as an opportunity to explore our own social, political and far-reaching ideas.

Because we will meet on Zoom, those now living elsewhere during part of the year or who have moved away will be able to participate, and our discussions will also be open to non-Cedars participants.

Each month a different person can select a film for the group to watch and then facilitate the discussion.

Seeking "Salvation by Bibliography" as our late friend Marvin Evans used to say, we meet to discuss books that can intrigue and might enlighten us.



Our March selection is *American Sage - The Spiritual Teachings of Ralph Waldo Emerson*, the latest title by Cedars member **Barry Andrews (**who can also provide copies for sale).

A review summary: "Even during his lifetime, Ralph Waldo Emerson was called the Sage of Concord, a fitting title for this leader of the American Transcendentalist movement. Everything that he said and wrote directly addressed the conduct of life, and unsurprisingly, he sought to rescue spirituality from decay, eschewing dry preaching and rote rituals."

Barry has spent years studying Emerson, finding wisdom and guidance in his teachings and practices, and witnessing how the spiritual lives of others are enriched when they grasp the many meanings in his work. Based on scholarship grounded in historical detail, this enlightening book considers the nineteenth-century religious and intellectual crosscurrents that shaped Emerson's worldview to reveal how his spiritual teachings remain timeless and modern, universal and uniquely American.

We will discuss the book via Zoom (with Barry Andrews' invited participation) as follows: March 8, Intro and Chapters 1-4; March 22, Chapters 5-7; April 5, Chapters 8-10; and April 19, Chapters 11-13.
