# **Rev. Zackrie Vinczen**



In 1963 the nascent Unitarian Universalist Association of Congregations voted on a **Statement of Social Justice** that urged law makers to reform the statutes governing abortion

in the United States. This was 10 years before the 1973 Roe v. Wade case that affirmed a woman's right to choose.

At the UUA's 1973 General Assembly, just after Roe vs. Wade, the gathered delegates voiced their support of the Supreme Court's decision with another **Statement of Social Justice** in which it was written "BE IT RESOLVED: That we support the US Supreme Court ruling on abortion and its implementation."

For decades Unitarian Universalists have fought for and affirmed the right to bodily autonomy—especially in reproduction. I know the recent leaked decision from the Supreme Court is a major blow to the decades of hardfought progress, however, I pray that we can keep our faith and continue to work to Peaceful Morning Farm is in the process of receiving non-profit status and is currently accepting donations directly through Helpline House. Funds generated by these events will support Cedars Church operations in the coming fiscal year. Your participation will be thankfully appreciated.





## Safe Gatherings at Cedars

With care, but also some comfort in the recognition that covid-related constraints on our activities are being relaxed as infection rates drop, our services in Webster Hall are beginning to enjoy the familiar accommodation and settings of our past presence there.

Our seating arrangements have evolved from six feet of separation between seat pairs or family groups, to three-foot separation of pairs or groups, and is now providing a mix of standard seating sections and spaced pairs allowing individuals to choose the protective isolation and arrangement they prefer as we return to the relatively familiar environment of our previous experience.

With caution, singing is now returning as an integral part of our worship services. Masks need to be worn while singing but can be taken off during the rest of the service (and during Coffee Hour). Free masks are available for anyone wanting to sing at church.
