

Special Collection Peaceful Morning Farm

Cedars holds a Special Collection monthly for community outreach as a way to educate our

congregation about the work of various nonprofit organizations that reflect our values and to channel our generosity in support of them.

Rescheduled this month, the Social Justice Committee has chosen to collect money for Peaceful Morning Farm, a local organic farm on Bainbridge Island. All money donated in the Sunday offering on May 22nd will benefit Peaceful Morning Farm. These gifts will be used to grow organic fresh produce for local food banks including Helpline House and Fishline. The farm is run entirely with volunteer labor, with the mission to help those in need, promote healthy eating, and foster awareness of sustainable agriculture.

Peaceful Morning Farm is in the process of receiving non-profit status and is currently accepting donations directly through Helpline House. Monies received through the Special Collection will be sent to Helpline House and designated for Peaceful Morning Farm through their partnership. For more information about their work, visit



Safe Gatherings at Cedars

With care, but also some comfort in the recognition that covid-related constraints on our activities are being relaxed as infection rates drop, our services in Webster Hall are beginning to enjoy the familiar accommodation and settings of our past presence there.

Our seating arrangements have evolved from six feet of separation between seat pairs or family groups, to more flexible separation of pairs or groups in response to current safety guidelines released by COVIDactnow.org.

We have also now been trying to provide a mix of standard seating sections and spaced pairs allowing individuals to choose the protective isolation and arrangement they prefer as we return to the relatively familiar environment of our previous experience.
