

Sad News

It is with sadness that I write to inform you of the death of **Brian Leekley**. Brian died on Monday June 13th at the Bainbridge Island Health and Rehabilitation Center.

Brian had been a member of Cedars since 2019 and was known for his detailed observations of situations and the world around him.

Brian's niece said his death was sudden and unexpected. Brian was admitted to the hospital on Thursday of last week after experiencing some internal pain. From there he was sent to BI Health and Rehabilitation so he could continue to be monitored. As of Sunday he reported feeling great, but his condition turned suddenly on Monday morning.

Service details are yet unknown, but I will work to communicate them as they become known.

At this time, I ask the entire Cedars Community to hold Brian's family in your thoughts and prayers. also now respond to safety guidelines released by COVIDactnow.org as follow: Kitsap County has seen an uptick in Covid spread and is now in the "Yellow" rating zone. This means we request that people mask when in groups and at Sunday Services. We know masking is one of the most effective protections for yourself and others nearby.

You can check the Kitsap County Health Department's tracking online at covidactnow.org or the CDC link at https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/covid-by-county.html to track Kitsap County numbers.

Vaccinations are also proven ways to both avoid getting sick or to severely lessen the vitriol of the virus. Our hearts go out to our community members who cannot get vaccines or boosters due to medical issues— all the more reason for the rest of us to practice safe behaviors to protect them, such as getting vaccinated and boosted if medically possible.

Let's not only talk-the-talk, let's walk-the-walk by what we say in unison on Sundays: let's "treat all people kindly because we are one family." **Your Cedars Board of Trustees**

Cedars Personnel Policy Manual

The Board of Trustees has adopted Cedars' first-ever Personnel Policy Manual, providing clear information about expectations, procedures, and benefits for Cedars staff, and intended as a valuable management resource for the Board, Minister, and congregation going forward.

The Manual was developed using input from many sources, including listening sessions the Board conducted during Fall of 2021, many one-on-one conversations between Board and Cedars members, and information gathered during the Board's Belonging Initiative.

The Manual was the work of many people. An initial draft was developed by Herb Hethcote, John Wiens, and Richard Wilson after many hours discussing and refining a proposal. Subsequently, a Review Group consisting of Heidi Parkington-Thal, Tyler Weaver, Susan Shaffer, Robyn Teske, and Kassia Sing contributed further input.

Finally, the full Board conducted its own review before adopting the finished Personnel Policy Manual at the April 28th Board Meeting.

A few policies covered in the Manual include: 1) The Minister needs to consult with the Board prior to making any decisions regarding dismissing staff; 2) A new procedure for handling grievances; and 3) Avoiding

We will discuss the book via Zoom on July 12th. For more information contact **Alan Miller**




