#### **Water Ceremony**



A UU Perspective on Labor Day

Day has become an end of summer holiday for having a barbecue and shopping (now rivaling Black Friday), or even a day for changing clothing rules, such as the end of wearing white during the summer (particularly in womens shoes).

Although its origins and purpose are mostly forgotten or only vaguely remembered, Monday's holiday is the annual day in the year when our nation typically takes note of the importance and value of workers who contribute their labor to the well-being of not only themselves but to our economy and to the well-being of our nation as a whole.

This celebration of the value of work is deeply rooted in our American culture going back to the Puritan beliefs about work being a Godgiven responsibility that benefits both individuals and society. The American myth about how individual hard work leads to riches and respect was promoted by the stories written in the mid-nineteenth century by the one-time Unitarian minister named Horatio Alger and later legitimized by the idea of the Protestant work ethic in its claim as the foundation of capitalism.

How we might appreciate the meaning of Labor Day and UU views on it from a historical perspective was explored a few years ago by the Harrisonburg Unitarian Universalists in Virginia's Shenandoah Valley and shared with the rest of us at this **link** 

#### Safe Gatherings at Cedars

Our congregation values using sound science and following advice of health agencies to adapt our safety guidelines to the changing status of the COVID-19 virus. You may find our current COVID Safety Guidelines on the Cedars Website. It now includes the current Community Risk Level and a table describing what precautions we are implementing for indoor gatherings. We are currently at GREEN, meaning Masking is optional, but Masks are required when singing.

The Cedars Board of Trustees has also decided to no longer require vaccinations at gatherings, though we do ask that all unvaccinated individuals wear masks and maintain appropriate physical distancing at all times. Community vaccination rates in Kitsap County are now at 80% and we know that a few people at Cedars have not been able to obtain vaccines. Our gathering precautions include social and physical distancing and increased ventilation at the current Community Risk Level.

The people at Cedars UU Church care deeply about each other and the community we have built together. We trust that each person will act responsibly to protect themselves and others using masks, distancing, and other precautions. Following these guidelines will

Our monthly potlucks are family friendly events!



We are all in this together, and as we say in unison on Sundays: let's "treat all people kindly because we are one family."



finds himself confronted with the ugly reality of sectarian conflict.



Seeking "Salvation by Bibliography" as our late friend Marvin Evans used to say, we meet to discuss books that can intrigue and might enlighten us.



Our current selection, proposed by Richard Wilson, is *Chief Seattle and the Town that took his name* by David Buerge.

Historian Buerge has assembled disparate accounts of the time from the 1780's to the 1860s—including native oral histories, Hudson's Bay Company records, pioneer diaries, and historic newspaper reporting to tell the story of an era of tremendous flux, turmoil, and violence during which a Native American war leader became an advocate for peace and strove to create a successful racial hybrid community.
