**Please plan to remain in Webster Hall after the service for a mid-year congregational meeting.**

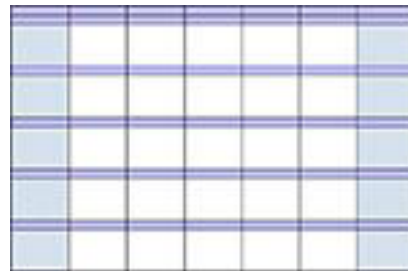

### Social Action as a Cedars Priority

Documenting past-year accomplishments, Cedars' Social Action Committee has shared a summary of 2022 activities in a year-end report ([Link](#)).

Reorganizing itself as a single comprehensive justice/action entity, the committee collected almost \$6000 in monthly special collections, participated with Congregation Kol Shalom in the preparation and offering of monthly Super Supper meals, and guided Cedars' engagement in another dozen significant programs and activities, as well as in sponsoring social action-oriented Sunday sermons or associated activities.

Additionally, the committee has achieved board recognition and approval of social action as a top Cedars priority for the coming 2023 year.

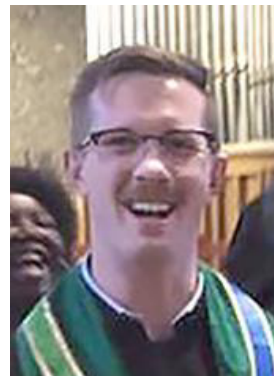
#### Continued Caution to Prevent Viral Flu Spread

Cedars organizes and gathers a monthly **Special**

as a way to educate our congregation about the work of various non-profit organizations that reflect our values, and to channel our generosity in support of them.

On January 22nd, the Social Action Committee has chosen to collect money for the **Kitsap Racial Equity and Empowerment Fund** (KREEF). All money donated in the Sunday offering on January 22nd will benefit the Kitsap Racial Equity and Empowerment Fund, a program through the Kitsap Community Foundation that addresses systemic inequities which disproportionately impact Black and other communities of color and that are amplified by COVID-19.

In 2021, KREEF awarded \$117,500 to more than 20 Black, Indigenous, and people of color-led or serving nonprofits and fiscally sponsored projects whose leadership or boards are reflective of and accountable to communities of color, in particular the Black community throughout Kitsap County. This year, since we know most taxpayers no longer itemize deductions, we will not be sending out 2022 tax letters to all church members. If you do itemize your IRS deductions and need a letter detailing all of your 2022 contributions, please send an email request to [bookkeeper@cedarsuuchurch.org](mailto:bookkeeper@cedarsuuchurch.org). A letter will be sent to you showing all January - December 2022 payments received by Cedars for pledges, non-pledged gifts, and special collections.

In early January, pledge statements will be sent out. These statements will reflect all pledge payments received from July through December 2022. That time frame encompasses the first half of the Cedars fiscal year, which ends in June 2023.

### Rest is Resistance

Please join us after service on January 29th when Rev. Zackrie will facilitate a discussion on rest as a form of resistance.

Based on the work of **Tricia Hersey** who leads a movement called the Nap Ministry, we will consider rest as a form of social justice and reparation.

Tricia, a theologian, artist, and community organizer, is author of **Rest is Resistance: A Manifesto** and curates spaces and forums for communities to rest. She says, "The Nap Ministry is not a religious movement but a spiritual antidote to the very earthly problems that are plaguing communities: exhaustion, chronic diseases and mental health crises - issues she sees as arising from systems of capitalism and white supremacy."

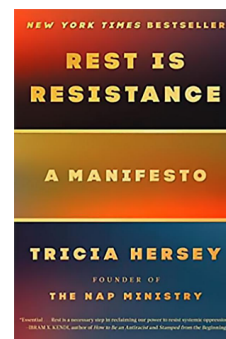

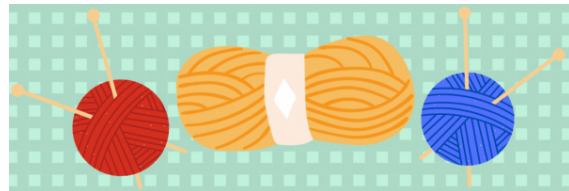
