## 7 principles? 8 principles? No Principles?



# Women's Covenant Groups Reforming


All Cedars people who identify as women are invited to a meeting scheduled for 7 pm on Tuesday February 28th to enable reformation of Women's Covenant Groups. The meeting will be on Zoom due to concerns about Covid, as well as to use its Breakout Room feature to more easily create new groups. Once in Breakout Rooms, groups will select the day and time for their first meeting, either in-person or on Zoom, as well as their group leader(s).

A covenant group is a small relational group of people who meet regularly to establish deeper relationships among themselves and within the congregation. Cedars currently has four women's groups; some may continue as they are, but most will end and members will participate in one of the new groups. This reformation will be in effect for one year.
