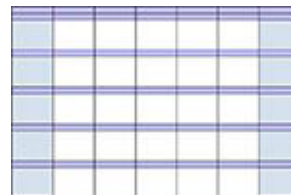

Cedars holds a Special Collection monthly for community outreach to educate our

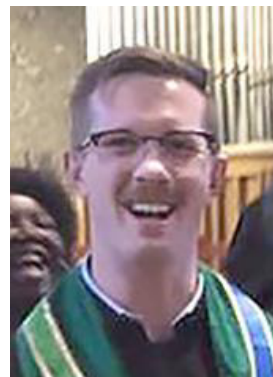
congregation about the work of various non-profit organizations that reflect our values and to channel our generosity in support of them.
