

### General Assembly's Ware Lecture: Imani Perry



The Unitarian Universalist General Assembly is a remarkable gathering. I have been attending virtually this week. It's not

as impactful, but still informative. Some of the highlights of GA include the workshops, worship services (sometimes with thousands of people) and the Ware Lecture.

The Ware Lecture features prominent thinkers of our time. It has been held since 1921, only missing a year or two. It has featured such luminaries as Howard Thurman, Linus Pauling and Martin Luther King, Jr.

This year, I invite you to join me to watch it virtually on Saturday, June 24 at 4:30pm at the Church Office. The featured speaker is Imani Perry. Perry is the Hughes-Rogers Professor of African American Studies at Princeton University and a faculty associate with Gender and Sexuality Studies and Jazz Studies. In the summer of 2023 she will join the faculty at Harvard University. She is a contributing writer for The Atlantic, and the author of seven books, most recently **South to America: A Journey Below the Mason-Dixon to Understand the Soul of a Nation** (Ecco Books, 2022), which received the 2022 National Book Award for Nonfiction.
