

General Assembly 2024

General Assembly (or GA) is the annual gathering of Unitarian Universalists, where we conduct business of the Association, explore the theological underpinnings of our faith, and lean fully into our mission and principles.

Although typically organized as a physical assembly of congregational delegates, this year's GA will instead be virtual, with "Love Unites, Stories Ignite" as an organizing theme celebrating love as a profound and binding force transcending boundaries and historical traditions within our faith communities and beyond, while our stories and the power of storytelling can ignite change, inspire compassion, and help us build a more just and equitable world.

The 63rd General Assembly will take place virtually **Thursday**, **June 20 through Sunday**, **June 23**, and you can now view the GA schedule to see the lineup of informative workshops, inspirational worship services, and more!

Article II: Principles or Values?

The UU community is abuzz about the proposed changes to Article II in the UUA Bylaws. That Article outlines some of the core elements of the Unitarian Universalist movement in the United States (Canada and other countries have their own guidance). In June we will vote on whether to change them.



The singing duo, **Emma's Revolution** is coming to Edmonds UU Congregation!



Because we found our recent selection by Carl Safina deeply fascinating and


hypocrisy and absolutism of sectarian religion. His god was in the woods, not in a church. He was, if anything, a nature mystic and a pantheist. His spirituality was devoid of doctrines or formulas or philosophic propositions. It had primarily to do with transcendent experiences triggered by his encounter with the natural world.

"The art of life," he wrote. "By what disciplines to secure the most life."

The disciplines he practiced and described in Walden and elsewhere include leisure, self-reliance, reading, contemplation, solitude, sauntering in nature, simple living and journal writing. By such practices we may, even today, attempt "to secure the most life."
