Social Action Committee Service Highlights

Last Sunday, we heard from the Social Action Committee. Below are the highlights from each topic of discussion.

CLIMATE: The Island School is interested in installing solar panels on the school. We discussed the possibility of Cedars providing financial support to install the panels. We also discussed doing a tour of a wind farm near Ellensburg with those interested.



FOOD SECURITY: So many people suffer from food and other insecurities. Fishline and Helpline House are working to meet those needs. They both need volunteers and donations that Cedars can help with. The monthly community dinners are an interfaith effort to help provide food and support.

IMMIGRATION: My takeaway is that all these things are related and even overlap. Anti-Racism and Immigrant rights are human rights as are voting rights and having a future for our children. The right to food and shelter is so basic it should go without saying...and yet here we are!

VOTING RIGHTS: I'm excited that Cedars is standing up for voting rights. I'm inviting Cedars members to write letters encouraging potential voters and to send notes of appreciation to our representatives working hard to protect democracy. It's a small gesture, but one that can mean a lot — many officials say they rarely hear words of thanks.

Thank Our Representatives for Protecting Our Vote




Cedars Facebook Conversations
