

Margo, wearing her new stole, joined several other clergy members from faith communities in Suquamish, Poulsbo, and Bainbridge at the Transgender Day of Remembrance at the Bainbridge Island Museum of Art. These faith leaders all spoke eloquently about how their faith traditions supported the inherent worth and dignity of all people, including transgender folks. Many Cedars members also attended and participated in reading



the names and stories of trans people who have died in the past year by suicide or murder.


Cedars Facebook Conversations
