### The Many Moods of the Christmas Season

"This too belongs," is a mantra taught by respected Buddhist teacher, Tara Brach. She means that all feelings have a place and should not be divided into "bad" to be repressed and "good" to be celebrated. I find her mantra especially helpful during the holiday season, for both joy and mourning belong.

My Thanksgiving was very different this year. After more than 30 years of gathering at my

aunt and uncle's condo to celebrate holidays and special occasion, my aunt and uncle died this past year and their condo was sold this past September. Also, due to moves and divorce, what was once a gathering of ten to twelve people, is now a gathering of seven. For the seven, we were excited to gather and yet profoundly missing the elders and in-laws and the sacred place where we always gathered. We still lit candles, ate wonderful hand-prepared foods and told stories. But sadness also spoke at our new table, and we made room for it to dine with us.

During this holiday season it is quite likely that you are someone you care about is feeling sadness or increased stress during December. Perhaps dealing with health decline or chronic pain, divorce, or the death of a loved one. The National Alliance on Mental Illness found that among those polled: 64% of people living with mental illness report that their conditions worsened around the holidays. And the American Psychological Association reports that 38% of people they polled reported increased stress levels during December. This is the time of year to make self-care an even higher priority, to reach out to others, and to know that your Cedars community cares about you.

If you are having a blue holiday season, here are some suggestions:

- Don't personalize it. It's not a defect in you. Millions of people are impacted the same way this time of year.
- Keep your expectations realistic, don't ask too much of yourself or others. Instead notice small kindnesses and contributions.
- Reject societal messages of a perfect holiday season.
- · Talk with your Primary Care Provider.
- If you are lonely, be in community. Volunteer where you can have contact with people. Come to our late afternoon Solstice and Christmas Eve services.
- Share with your minister. My door is open for you every Tuesday morning from 9:30am until noon on December 9th, 16th, & 23rd. You might even run into others who are feeling the same way.
- If it is a family member or friend who is suffering, ask them how they are "really" doing.
   Explain that you genuinely want to know and are there to listen.
- Choose hope. Choose to believe that not all days will feel this way and that others in your community care about your welfare.

May we find comfort in naming these feelings of joy, longing, and sadness, and find some peace in being together. Remember, your very existence is a miracle to be celebrated.


### **Ongoing Programs**


